Breathing Places

The BBC Breathing Places grant money that we received has enabled some very real improvements to the wildlife and community resources available at Ogden Water. The £9750 of grant was spent on four main projects; a wildflower area, nest box camera, interpretation panels and, last but not least, the pond restoration

The camera has already proven very successful, delighting visitors with live video images of a pair of nesting blue tits who successfully reared a brood of 9 chicks earlier this year.



However, there is no doubt that the main legacy will be the restored pond, with the addition of a new dipping platform. With water control measures in place, excavations carried out and all of the invasive weed removed. We look forward to this vastly improved habitat encouraging many different types of aquatic invertebrates to settle and take up residence. Together with the new dipping platform, the pond will provide an excellent base from which to carry out field studies and educational activities with school and community groups for the next decade.

STOP PRESS

The bird box camera that brought us much closer to the lives of the Ogden water Blue Tits has been adapted. With the aid of a chocolate box, plywood and some sticky-back plastic, visitors can now see the Ogden Water bird table camera on the TV in the visitor centre. We have already had close up views of many birds including jays & woodpeckers

The Autumn Talks Programme

The Rush for Wind 16th September 2008
Unfortunately this talk was cancelled and will be re-arranged for the new year. Instead our own Chris Buckley gave an entertaining talk on the creation of **Bradford's Millennium Way**, a 45 mile walk around many familiar and some unfamiliar local beauty spots.

Chris is one of the founders and designers of the walk, and he explained how it grew from first ideas, identifying the route, building bridges and putting up way markers. It took 18 months, involving a lot of effort, and much fun and amusement along the way dealing with local people, local pubs and the elements. The walk is used extensively today and its status is such that it is now shown on O.S. maps. A variety of charities also organise events on it.

As if the 45 mile route was not enough, Chris and his friends then created a series of circular walks, so that the Millennium Way can be enjoyed in small sections. Books on the Way and the Circular walks are available from the shop at Ogden Water. Many of us will be inspired to explore more of this countryside following Chris's talk.

Thanks to Chris for standing in at such short notice.

On 15th October, Jean Evans from the National Trust gave an informative and entertaining talk on the smaller properites of the National Trust. Titled 'I Could Live Here' all attending unamiously agreed that they could easily live in some of the properties, too!

Adder update

Over the summer, eyes have once again turned towards the moors in search of adders. Last year they caused quite a stir when spotted sun bathing on the golf course.

This year, a small scale monitoing project is underway at Ogden. Small corrugated sheets have been placed around the estate in sheltered, sunny spots. It is hoped these may attract any adders as they look for suitable places to catch some warmth. The corrugated sheets are checked visually by looking on the tops and also very carefully lifting them to see what lurks underneath. Although no adders have been seen on them, Chris Sutcliffe has got a couple of excellent shots of common lizards he found underneath.



Chris S. and some of the volunteers did try to do some mammal trapping on the moorland near to the tins. We wanted to find out what food there might be around for the adders, however of the 15 traps that were set, none of them had any small mammals in them the following moring.

Species rediscovered

Whilst searching for adders, Chris S. found a different BAP species whilst looking for another!

Under one of the tins was the caterpillar of the Golden Rod Brindle moth. This species that feeds on heather & bilberry and has not been recorded in Calderdale since 1955.


SHORT WALKS AROUND OGDEN WATER LOCAL NATURE RESERVE



Walk 1: The Waterside Walk Time: 40 minutes. Distance: 1.25 miles

Walk 2: The Woodland Trail Time :1.5 hours. Distance: 2.5 miles

Walk 3: The Giants Tooth Trail Time: 2.5 hours. Distance: 3.5 miles
